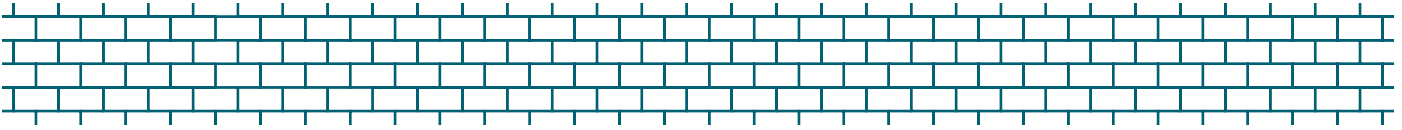

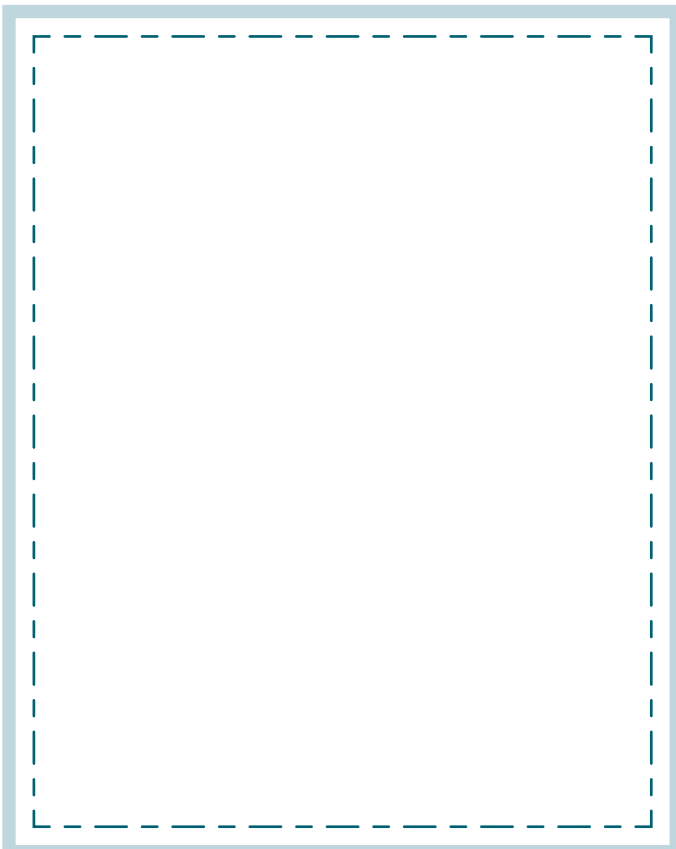
Visit the *Scotland galleries* to complete this trail.

Draw 3 of them.

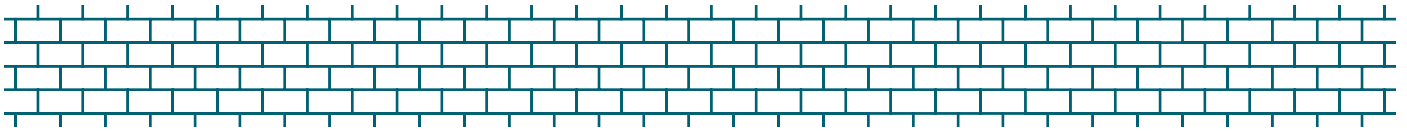


How many different colours can you see?

Go to Level 3 – Scotland Transformed

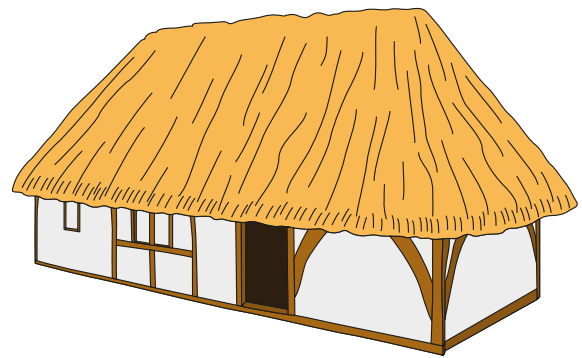
2. Find the Cruck House (look for the very old looking house).

How do you think they change the bulbs?



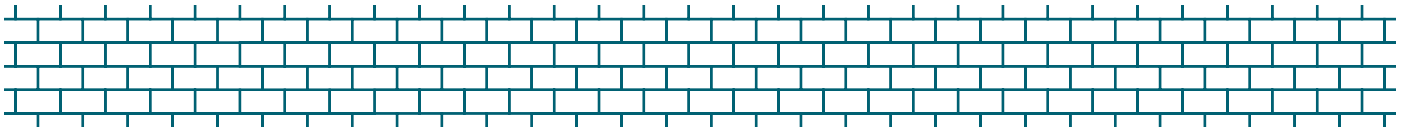
